# Message from the Chair

MAGNOLIA continues to be a vital tool throughout Mississippi in its support of teaching, research and service in public libraries, schools, community colleges, and university libraries and through many other state agencies. The success of this program is due to the hard work and team -effort of many individuals. Many of these "team-effort" projects are reflected in this issue of the

The strong and continuing support of the Mississippi Legislature has been vital to MAGNOLIA's growth and continuation. Leaders in the Legislature and members of the Executive Branch, especially those who have "championed" the project, are to be complimented for their continuing support. We must all be sure to thank our legislators and others for this support. Now would be a good time to telephone or write them a note of appreciation.

Through an appropriation of \$568,000 from the Legislature in August 1997, which initiated the project, the citizens of Mississippi were provided with on-line access to more than 2,500 full-text journal titles, and over 4,000 individual and abstracted journal titles. At that time, there were four (4) major vendors under contract with subscriptions to fifteen (15) databases. In 1998, an appropriation of \$915,000 was received. In 1999, MAGNOLIA was supported with a budget of \$1,086,359. Currently, there are subscriptions to more than thirty (30) databases and access to more than 4000 indexed and abstracted journal titles. Earlier this month, a request for funding in the amount of \$1,306,000 was made before the Legislative Budget Committee. If received, this appropriation would provide for the continuation, with some increases, in current subscriptions and the possible addition of some new titles, which have been recommended through the Database Selection Committee.

The reports received during the Steering Committee Meeting on September 15 were all positive. Committee work and subcommittee work continues. This work makes the difference in the success of MAGNOLIA.

Participation in the LAMP tours was successful. This participation included presentations and an exhibit booth, which further enhanced the tour activities. Earlier participation in the Mississippi Reading Conference, which primarily involved classroom teachers, provided much need visibility for MAGNOLIA.

Additional publicity materials are being made available and recommendations for additional databases are always open and ongoing. Training sessions continue – those that are reflected herewith and other sessions through other projects. Note the section on "MAGNOLIA Training" which indicates that over 250 individuals at 13 different locations were trained during the fall session's projects. Also, there are two (2) Training Sessions available at the October MLA Conference. One session is scheduled for the morning and one for the afternoon. Please be aware of these sessions. Check the new web pages that have been designed specifically for K-12 schools, community colleges and public libraries.

The foregoing is just a brief overview of the progress that is being made on behalf of MAGNOLIA. This project involves all of us – working together as a "Team". Thank you for your work and your continued support. I look forward to seeing/working with you in the very near future. In the meantime, if you have questions, do not hesitate to contact me or other members of the Steering Committee/Subcommittees.

# New web pages created to provide easy access to MAGNOLIA databases... no usernames/passwords required

In April, 2000, MAGNOLIA released a set of new web pages designed specifically for K-12, community college and public libraries. The K-12 web page was designed so that K-12 schools that are on the statewide backbone provided by the State Department of Education will be able to access the MAGNOLIA products without entering a username/password.

The public and community college library page was designed so that each library will have their own MAGNOLIA web page. The links to the MAGNOLIA databases will be setup so that each library will continue to obtain statistics for their library. The first time someone accesses the public and community college library web page, they select their library and it creates a web page for their library. This newly created page can be bookmarked or used on a library web site to provide easy access to the MAGNOLIA products.

In addition to the links to the MAGNOLIA Databases, the new web pages also contain information about new software releases, new MAGNOLIA products, a documentation center which provides links to documentation for most of the MAGNOLIA products, information on how to access the MAGNOLIA products from home, a link to the MAGNOLIA web page and much more.

MAGNOLIA has added a couple of databases to the suite of products being offered to the citizens of Mississippi.



**NoveList** is an electronic readers' advisory resource, which assists fiction readers in finding new authors and titles. Through it's attractive and easy-to-use interface, **NoveList** allows readers to use a favorite author or title as a template to locate other authors and titles of interest. Readers can also enter words that describe the contents of a book they would like to read and **NoveList** retrieves titles that contain these words in the book's subject headings field. Users can also browse over 1,200 theme-oriented booklists, 150 award-lists and 1,000 fiction related web sites. (This product is for Public Libraries only.)

During contact negotiations this year, the **Gale Group** decided to add, at no additional cost, **Contemporary Authors Online** to the list of products being offered. **Contemporary Authors Online** offers your students and patrons continuous access to current biographical and bibliographical data on modern authors, while eliminating your need for product storage.

Each Contemporary Authors Online citation contains the most complete and up-to-date entry, accessible through an easy-to-use interface with a variety of search paths to help you locate the information you need quickly and efficiently. You can easily search for an author by name, current address, title of work, nationality, date and place of birth, education, memberships, interests and much more.



# FirstSearch receives a facelift

The re-designed FirstSearch service offers expanded search capabilities and integrates access to information from library collections, reference databases, online full text, electronic journals, and the Internet. Using the World Wide Web, patrons can connect to the online service from workstations in the library—or from their homes or offices. ### **EBSCOHost Databases**

#### **NoveList** — Public Libraries Only

Through its attractive and easy-to-use interface, *NoveList* allows readers to use a favorite author or title as a template to locate other authors and titles of interest. Readers can also enter words that describe the contents of a book they would like to read, and *NoveList* retrieves titles that contain these words in the book's subject headings field. In addition, users can browse over 1,200 themeoriented book lists, 150 award lists and 1,000 fiction related web-sites.

#### ACADEMIC SEARCH FULLTEXT ELITE

Gain access to information from a wide range of academic areas, including social sciences, humanities, education, general science, multi-cultural and general reference with Academic Search FULLTEXT. This comprehensive database features full text for over 1,260 journals, abstracts and indexing for over 3,100 scholarly journals, as well as coverage of The Wall Street Journal, The New York Times and The Christian Science Monitor.

#### MASTERFILE FULLTEXT

Gain access to information on a broad range of topics including general interest, business, health and multi-cultural with Master-FILE FullTEXT. MasterFile offers more than 3,100 titles indexed and abstracted, plus searchable ASCII full text for more than 1,840 active titles.

#### BUSINESS SOURCE ELITETM

Gather business news from the most popular national and international financial, banking, and industry publications with Business Source Elite. Ideal for community colleges and universities, Business Source Elite covers international business, economics, management, operations, finance, accounting and labor.

#### **NEWSPAPER SOURCE**

Contains abstracting and indexing from the following papers (cover to cover): The New York Times, Wall Street Journal (Eastern and Western editions), Christian Science Monitor, USA Today, Los Angeles Times, and the Washington Post. Abstracting and indexing for all titles and full text for the Christian Science Monitor begins 1/1/95. Coverage includes everything except obituaries (excluding celebrities), sports tables, ads/classifieds, stock prices and weather.

#### HEALTH SOURCE PLUSTM

Find answers to health-related questions with Health Source Plus, a dramatic expansion of EBSCO's existing Health Source research tool. This database offers coverage of general health magazines as well as professional health care journals. Provides indexing and abstracting for nearly 500 consumer health, nutrition, and professional titles. 270 titles are covered in full text. Full text coverage of 1,000 health pamphlets is included.

#### MAS ONLINE

Provides complete abstract coverage for approximately 500 general interest magazines plus the keyword searchable full text for 210 journals and thousands of Magill Book Reviews. A cumulative database, with the earliest abstracts beginning in 1984 and earliest full text in 1990.

#### **ERIC®**

Gain immediate access to information from journals included in the Current Index: Journals in Education, and Resources in Education Index with ERIC. Created to assist researchers, teachers and administrators.

#### MIDDLE SEARCH PLUSTM

Gather information on a wide range of general topics with Middle Search Plus. This extensive database is designed to assist middle and junior high school students in learning how to research current events.

#### PRIMARY SEARCH<sup>TM</sup>

Gather information on a wide range of general topics with Primary Search. This database is designed for elementary schools and children's reading rooms.

#### **EBSCO Animals**

EBSCO's Encyclopedia of Animals offers in-depth information on a variety of topics relating to animals. The database consists of abstracts and full text records describing the nature and habitat of familiar animals. Within some of the full text, image links are available for the Windows client. Images are accessed by double-clicking any image graphic.

#### Funk & Wagnalls New Encyclopedia

For students and adults alike, the Funk & Wagnalls New Encyclopedia database indexes over 25,000 records. Full text for each record may be easily accessed by double clicking on the topic from the display.



# **OCLC FirstSearch**

#### WorldCat

Records of any type of material cataloged by OCLC member libraries. Includes manuscripts written as early as the 12th century.

#### ArticleFirst

Journals in science, technology, medicine, social science, business, the humanities, and popular culture.

#### NetFirst

Bibliographic citations including abstracts, subject headings, and classification codes. Includes a variety of Internet accessible resources including World Wide Web pages and Listservs. New resource types, including Usenet newsgroups, FTP sites, Gopher servers, and electronic publications in many formats will be coming soon.

#### **Electronic Collections Online**

A growing collection of journals in a variety of subject areas, all with full text articles available online. Articles are presented in page image formats (predominately PDF) that include all original content and images. The interface supports cross-journal searching and browsing within selected journals. Users can view bibliographic information for all journals and view full text articles from journals to which their institution subscribes.

#### **FastDoc**

FastDoc is a collection of articles that have a high percentage of citations that can be ordered for online viewing or email delivery. (This does not include the article...only citations to articles.)
